For many who have happy experiences of childhood Christmases, the memories will be good, but the baby in the manger may only be one feature among many – the Christmas tree, Santa, carols, family, presents, parties and too much food and drink?

But for others whose memories of Christmas are not happy, they may dread the festive season where everyone else seems to be enjoying themselves. Their hearts may be heavy as they face another, or perhaps the first, Christmas without a special loved one, or in the knowledge of continuing sickness, worry or relationship breakdown. For some this will be a 'blue' not a 'merry' Christmas.

Whatever our situations, happy or unhappy, the emotions stirred at this time of year can prevent us from recognising the things that are inessential and appreciating the real gift that God offers with the coming of Christ into the world. Whether we think that the Nativity story is true or a fable, or a bit of both, or whether we think it is really all for the children, we can still enter somehow into the mystery and wonder of that first Christmas night.

Somewhere deep in us all is a secret hope, a longing perhaps, to somehow rediscover and experience that sense of awe and wonder that hovers around on Christmas Eve. When just for a moment, the world seems to pause - what if it is really, really true - God did

intervene in the affairs of humankind 2,000+ years ago.? The baby Jesus was Emmanuel – God with us, and the message of the angels 'to you is born this day ... a Saviour, who is Christ, the Lord' -offers a way forward? A way into light and hope and peace.

What would it look like if it were true, what difference would it, could it make?

For many of us in the twenty-first century life is all hustle and bustle — what's the next thing that must be done, are we running late? Pressure and stress, worry, anxiety and fear. Somehow, sometime over the coming weeks can I suggest you take a few minutes to pause, to draw breath, to contemplate and, yes, perhaps to wonder.

In St Mary's Church we have created an area of seating and soft lighting for just that purpose. We've called it 'Breathing Space'. A place to sit and draw in something of the stillness, quietness and beauty of this special building and maybe to enjoy a moment of tranquillity. There are leaflets, thoughts, poems and prayers which may help.

I wish everyone a peaceful, hopeful and refreshing Christmastide, and pray that the message of the angels – 'peace on earth and goodwill to all' – will spread across our communities, our land and the whole world.

Here's a Christmas prayer:

You came as a baby, Lord, As a helpless little child Who relied on a human family To care for him.

You cried because you were hungry, Because you were homeless, Because you were a stranger, Far away from home.

You still cry with hunger, Lord, In the voices of many that are starving; Your tears still flow: For the homeless, The lonely, The forgotten. You still rely on human families to care.

And so this Christmas, Lord, we pray:
Help us to be the kind of people
Who look for you in the world,
And joyfully discover you as we care for one another.

The spirituality of play

October is a month where the family project has been filled with sacred moments that have come from engaging with play. Playing is something we all did as children; it enables creativity and imagination to flourish and opens our minds to engage with the intangible. Sadly, during adulthood our opportunities to play become less frequent. Some of us may play by having a sport hobby such as netball or running. Yet, this type of play can still come with a structure or rules. Structured play such as this is good for us; it increases our heart rate which is good for our physical health. It can help us connect with people who have this shared hobby or interest, combating loneliness and helping our mental health. Yet free flowing, imaginative and unstructured play is harder to find beyond school age.

Messy Harvest, which happened mid-October, had moments of this unstructured play. Adults and children alike picked up playdoh to create shapes. Some made food shapes which were related to the theme of harvest. Yet others simply sat allowing their imagination to make something different, using their hands as tools to sculpt and shape almost without thinking. As this happened, conversation flowed naturally and a sense of peace and calm descended on the faces of adults who were unknowingly resting through this action of play. As an observer this seemed a sacred moment; a moment where play enabled the peace that I associate with God to be felt perhaps momentarily by the person in play.

Graveyard Stories also provided opportunities for families to play. The different activities were structured but allowed space for creative play to flow through each individual as they made prayer wands and decorated bat biscuits. However the real playful enabler was the story-teller. Alongside the quiet that comes when a story is about to begin, there were murmurs of interest as well as bemusement. These slipped away as people became captivated by her playful art form. Her stories brought the laughter and humour of God into the night.

There is the oxymoron of a comfortable unpredictable element to listening to a storyteller. Not knowing the shape of the story is both captivating whilst also leaving the listeners on tenterhooks. The moment of not knowing what comes next enables a space for wonder. This moment of play seems to echo the ongoing reality of those who hold a faith; the oxymoron of both the struggle and comfort that one can find in wondering about an intangible being. Although holding a faith is about having knowledge, I think it is more about being comfortable in the space of wondering. Wondering isn't a sign we don't know the details; it is about acknowledging the element of mystery and unpredictable parts of creativity or in a faith context, the Creator.

A key part of play is imagination. Too often, we forget the power and importance of imagination. Einstein recognised the limit of knowledge when he said: 'Imagination is more important than knowledge. Knowledge is limited. Imagination encircles the world.' When we allow ourselves to play, tapping into our imagination and into the intangible, we enable moments to occur that aren't quantifiable but are very precious and at times sacred. This Christmas period, amongst the busyness, maybe we should spend some time playing and allow ourselves to be open to meeting with the fun loving, peace bringing, wonder giving Creator.

With the weather turning cold, wet, and wintry over the coming weeks and months, I thought it might be useful to share the following:

Potholes: Road surfaces often suffer at this time of year as a result of wet and freezing weather. Cumbria Highways rely on members of the public to report these faults either online at cumbria.gov.uk or via the Highways Hotline on 0300 303 2992. If you notice a new or existing pothole, please do let them know. You can also report empty or missing grit bins in the same way. Of course, I am always happy to report faults if you prefer (I am well practised!) just let me know!

Cold to Cosy Homes: At SLDC we are supporting a free project to help residents struggling with cold and draughty houses. Launched recently by Cumbria Action for Sustainability (CAfS), this new service offers free advice, energy-saving equipment and other practical help. Its advisors visit homes to recommend energy saving measures including LED light bulbs, draught exclusion and radiator reflectors that are free of charge.

The eligibility criteria for the scheme is really broad and I am keen for people to know that, if they have health problems, are benefits (inc child benefit), or have a relatively low income, they will probably qualify for this help. There's a New Green Heritage Plaque in Town!

The plaque commemorates the life of Jonty Wilson, blacksmith, antiquarian & broadcaster, who worked in the Fairbank Smithy for over 50 years. Jonty learned his trade as an apprentice on the Underley Estate and after service in WW1, he returned to Kirkby Lonsdale and took Understanding loss; The pain of grief – how it feels; The over the blacksmith's shop on Fairbank. With the advent of the motor car, Jonty diversified by teaching horse riding, lecturing and giving broadcasts for the BBC. In 1954 he co-presented a series of 8 programmes entitled 'The Old Straight Road—a horseback holiday', with Nancy Spain and John Peel, following their pony trek along the Fosse Way from Lincolnshire to Devon. He also contributed later to 'Holiday Hour' and 'Woman's Hour' on the Light Programme, as well as to 'Pony Parade' and 'Open-air Holidays—let's go riding' on the Home Service. There is currently a short video, featuring tales and photographs of Jonty, available to view in The Vault at the Tourist Information Centre on Main Street.

The Fairbank Smithy has had many uses over the years and is now a Grade II Listed Building within the Kirkby Lonsdale Conservation Area, with its original stone walls and main doors which still hold a record of graffiti from the past. 


