Habits, Traditions and Rituals

A few weeks ago, Radio Four's 'The Today Programme' invited responses to the question 'What brightens up your day?' They shared an audio recording sent in by June Tebay, a ninety-two-year-old lady who described (with sound effects) her daily ritual of pouring a gin and tonic. At 5.30 pm each day June makes her G&T and then lights a candle and sits and sips as she watches the flame and counts her blessings for family, friends, and health etc.

It really made me smile, it was the obvious pleasure and comfort she gained from this daily ritual. It was a marker in her day, a reflective and prayerful moment and something she had valued prior to and throughout lockdown.

Rituals and traditions are hugely important and lifesustaining for human beings.

Traditions emerge from the story of where we come from, they give us our identity and connect us to previous generations. Through ritual we build families and community, we grow, change and mark important events in our lives. Every family has its own traditions and rituals to some degree. Rituals motivate and move us help us find expression in times of joy and sorrow. They also bond us together and make us feel like we're part of something special and give us much needed comfort during difficult times.

D R Messenger writes,

"Ceremonies are an expression of culture," he adds, "mechanisms which express and generate love, forge and declare the bond between individuals, and establish and identify community." Dally R Messenger (1999) Ceremonies and Celebrations

There is a sense of before and after, that life has been touched by the experience and given deeper meaning.

Do we need traditions?

Traditions can offer a way to organise and centre us through life and especially at times of difficulty or uncertainty. In other words, these familiar actions provide a sense of calm and peace to our busy lives. From reciting blessings to raising a glass to make a toast, seasonal traditions are brimming with rituals. Research shows that the structured and repetitive actions involved in such rituals can act as a buffer against anxiety by making our world a more predictable place.

The rhythm of the seasons and the associated festivals provide markers through the year.

Christian practices and rituals are an important part of how we experience and practise faith and spirituality. Since the beginning of the pandemic we have been denied the means to practice our traditions in the usual way. Important rites of passage such as weddings, funerals and baptisms and celebration of birthdays and anniversaries have been significantly affected, leaving us feeling emotionally vulnerable, and in some way as though we are incomplete!

The major festivals of Easter, Harvest and Christmas were significantly curtailed last year but we tried hard to re-frame those rituals and traditions which enabled us to celebrate them and help us to feel connected as community. The traditions and rituals serve to remind us of God's eternal love, faithfulness, and grace.

When this edition is published, we will already be in the season of Lent, the very important 40-day tradition of preparing to commemorate the Death of Christ on Good Friday and the Resurrection Hope on Easter Morning. Lent is often associated with the tradition of giving things up. However, I think most people will feel we have given enough up this past year, so perhaps we can take the opportunity to explore and join in activities which will help us to energise us, encourage faith and keep us positive. We may well find we adapt our traditions or even make new traditions and rituals! Perhaps we need traditions and rituals more than ever in these uncertain times?

View from the Bridge

I am starting this month's view with some good news about the Play Park refurbishment. It was reported at the council meeting on the 10th February that Russell Armer are going to release the monies towards the work now rather than instalments as originally proposed. The Play Park committee are close to announcing which of the tenders has been successful. Cllr Marie Batty will be setting out details in April AKL, including acknowledgment to contributors that have helped in financing the project.

The next two council meetings will be held on Zoom and you can contact the Town Clerk if you wish to attend. The link is sent out seven days prior to the meeting. We have a 15-minute public participation for you to address the council. Unfortunately, we are unable to discuss matters raised so would have to be an agenda item for a future meeting. The reason is we can only discuss matters that have been published on the agenda which is prepared ahead of time. Strict rules governing council meetings don't allow any other business which is common practice at most other clubs or annual general meetings

An issue that has been doing the rounds on social media is the felling of trees. These are dealt with by SLDC and not the town council. A planning application along with a tree surgeon's report has to be submitted together with the reason for the felling. We lose very few, if any, to development, but usually they are a danger to life or property. Trees that come within the YDNP all require their permission to be felled, even those along the riverbank. During the latest storm and high-water levels, we lost three, and there are several more which need to be heavily pruned or removed before they do extensive damage to the bank. Thanks to the local Rotary Club and Peter Irving, several new trees have been planted in Jubilee Field but space in and around the town is very limited when it comes to planting trees.

The light at the end of the tunnel is coming but it is a very long one – much like the Gothard Tunnel in Switzerland! Our surgery is ahead in vaccinations and if we all support our local economy wherever possible, we will win.

My thanks to all the volunteers that are helping to keep our town ticking over, my helpers and Diane for help and support.

Plastic Free: do the best you can?

This may feel a daunting process once you take stock of how much plastic we actually use in our homes on a daily basis. Over the coming months I would like to guide you through some easy steps to achieving your goal. Remember - "We don't need a handful of people doing zero waste perfectly, we need millions of people doing it imperfectly". If you can go 100% plastic free then that's an amazing achievement but if, like me, you can only do as much as you can then that is better than nothing at all.

We'll start in the bathroom. When I looked into going plastic free it overwhelmed me - just take a moment and look at your bathroom. Study how many bottles, containers, lotions and potions all come in plastic containers. So, where do we start? By taking one step at a time and replacing each item with a plastic-free alternative or refill option as it runs out. Replace your toothbrush with a bamboo one or your electric toothbrush heads with ones that are recycled and can be recycled. Swap your shampoo and conditioner for solid bars or just refill the bottles that you already have with an environmentally friendly alternative. Change the way you wash by using solid soap or refillable body wash and ditch that scrunchie for a soap saver bag or washable cloth.

By doing just one thing at a time it won't be so overwhelming. Over time you will not only see a difference with the amount of bottles in your bathroom but you will also start to notice a difference with the pennies. There are plenty of options out there to meet everyone's personal preference, so come on everyone - let's start to make a difference today.


Scouting continues

The Fairbank Society Kirkby Lonsdale

Do you know an older person who is struggling with everyday chores and needing help but is reluctant to give up their home and move into a costly Care Home? 

David, a landscape archaeologist & historian, led a four-year archaeological project under the Yorkshire Dales 'Stories in Stone' programme investigating the history of Thorns. Thorns, an uninhabited hamlet close to Ribblehead Viaduct, was first recorded in 1190 as a lodge for Furness Abbey and the last record was in 1881. David will tell us about this project and what was uncovered.

Originating in the hiring fairs where farm workers and household servants were taken on, the Victorian fair developed into a huge popular event - part theatre, part circus, with music, drinking, boxing matches, betting, pickpocketing and eating. Particularly associated with the fair was the flying gingerbread man - possibly the first instance of fast food.

Members were enthralled by the talk which was illustrated with atmospheric contemporary images - some drawings and some photographs. Sadly there was no cup of tea and chat afterwards but members enjoyed being able to see one another even if only on a computer screen. We hope it won't be long until we can meet in the hall again.

Until then meetings will be via Zoom. Next month - 3rd March at 7.30 p.m. - the speaker will be Gary Prescott talking about his cycle trip around the country visiting RSPB sites.

The Corpse Roads of Cumbria

Alan Cleaver gave a talk via Zoom to over 80 people on The Corpse Roads of Cumbria. Corpse roads were those paths which led from remote areas to the mother church and along which pall bearers would carry the coffin.

There are probably about 30 such roads in the county, including at least one coming into Kirkby Lonsdale. Researching the corpse roads has drawn attention to a number of legends relating to deaths and funerals. These ranged from ringing of the church bell when someone was dying, the existence of a special death chair which was 'loaned' out so the dying person would be comfortable sitting in this, to the tradition of telling bees when someone dies so they would spread the message across the countryside. If you did not tell them, they would stop producing honey.

It was an entertaining and informative talk. Alan summed up the appeal of the Corpse Roads: while you may not be sure where the Corpse Roads goes, you can be sure of a very enjoyable walk and a chance to keep history alive.


