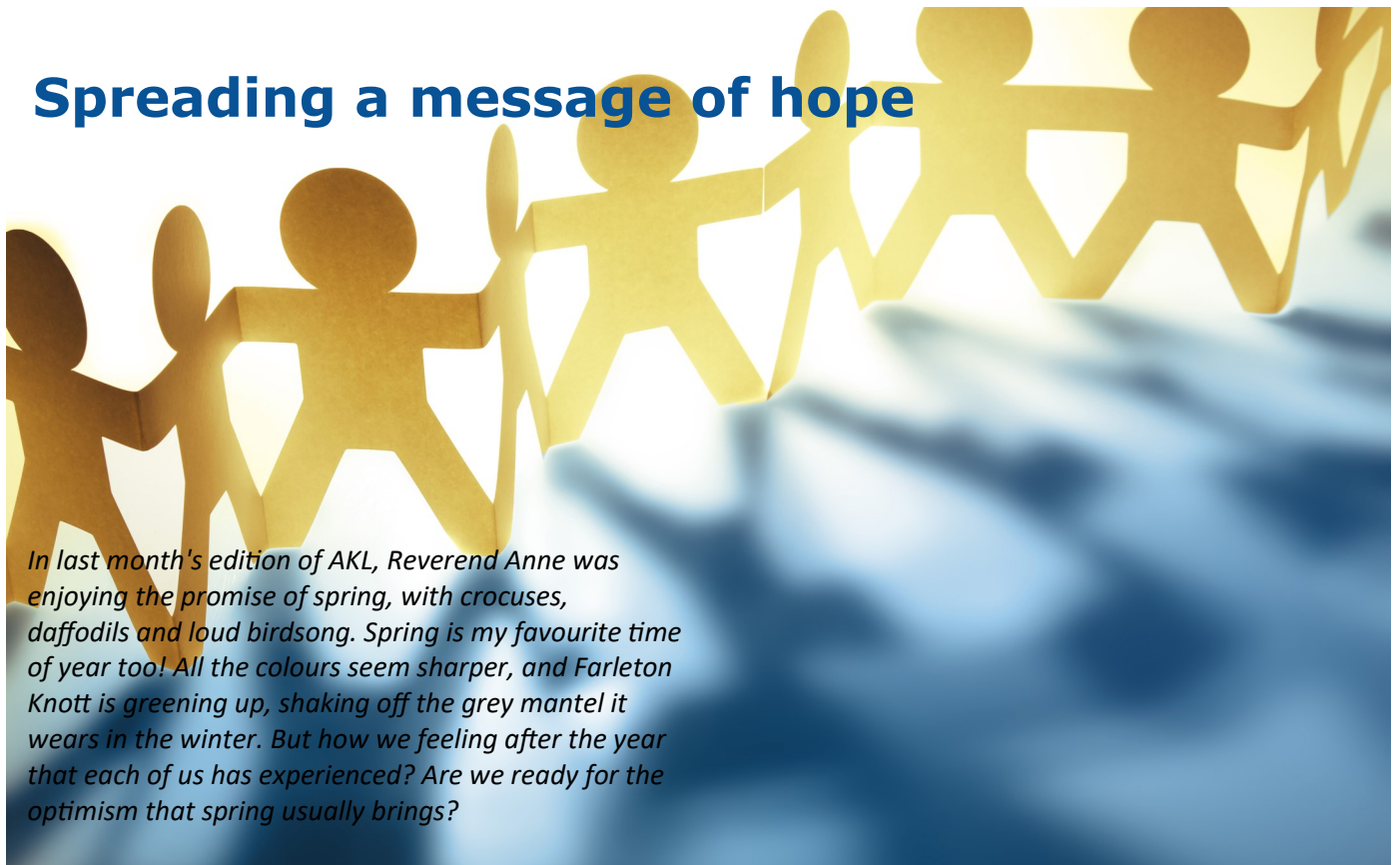

Spreading a message of hope



In last month's edition of AKL, Reverend Anne was enjoying the promise of spring, with crocuses, daffodils and loud birdsong. Spring is my favourite time of year too! All the colours seem sharper, and Farleton Knott is greening up, shaking off the grey mantle it wears in the winter. But how we feeling after the year that each of us has experienced? Are we ready for the optimism that spring usually brings?

As I write this, the Christian Church has just celebrated Easter. Although we had a very uplifting service in the open air at Kirby Lonsdale, in common with many churches across the Diocese, the Rainbow village churches were not open for worship. This felt different to 'normal' and many other things that we've we have been used to in the past, like socialising and going shopping, have been strangely 'different' over the past 12 months.

Just over one week after Easter Day, in our Bible readings we meet a character who most people will have come across: the man remembered as 'Doubting Thomas'. When the risen Christ visited the disciples a week after His resurrection, Thomas wasn't around. When the disciples eventually saw Thomas sometime later, they told him the good news, that they had seen the risen Jesus!

Like all of them, Thomas had been through a trauma. With the death of Jesus, all his plans and expectations had been dashed, and he was in mourning for his friend. Thomas wasn't going to allow himself to feel any 'hope' until he had seen some evidence of the disciples' claims: he needed to see Jesus' scars, to convince him that a crucified man really could come back to life.

When the risen Jesus visited the disciples two weeks after His resurrection, He instinctively knew what Thomas needed. Jesus showed Thomas his healed nail scarred hands and side, so that Thomas' mental scars, caused by the death of his friend, could be healed, and Thomas could hope again. Jesus is now in heaven, but He left his Holy Spirit here on earth as a godly presence that can connect us to Himself.

If the pandemic has left scars on us, Jesus understands, and can bring healing to us, if we ask Jesus in prayer.

There is documentary evidence that suggests Thomas went on to take the Christian gospel message to south west India, and founded a church in Kerala. If we ask Jesus to heal our 'pandemic wounds', maybe we can enjoy all that Spring offers as usual. Who knows what we could yet achieve if we allow Jesus to give us hope for 2021 and beyond!

We lowered the Union flag to half-mast and a White Ensign at half-mast on the second pole in recognition of his distinguished service in the Royal Navy during WW2. A minute's silence was observed by council members at the start of their meeting on the 14th April. The minutes are on the council's web site and on the notice board outside the Lunesdale Hall.

For those living alone, lockdown has been made easier by modern technology like Zoom or Skype. Not everybody has access to the internet (and it is not the same as being out with friends and relatives), though, and the one thing you cannot do virtually is have a hug! With shops opening and schools going back we need to be a little cautious; let us hope any rise in infection is minimal.

Thank you to Underley Estates for the new permissive footpath from Kearsick to the lodge on the B6254, making for a more pleasant and safer route away from the traffic, especially on this narrow road.

Thanks also go to the gentleman for his work painting the bollards on Main Street and around Mill Brow. Thanks to an initiative by the Chamber of Trade the footpath gullies in the town have been cleaned. Jobs like these make such a difference.

The annual town meeting has been brought forward a week to the first Wednesday in May and will be on Zoom. We have had to bring it forward due to that being the last date we can hold a meeting on Zoom and cannot meet face-to-face for a possible 2-3 months. Talks are ongoing at government level to get an extension to allow councils to use Zoom until in-person meetings can resume. The Family Project



Five ways to support your mental wellbeing.

This was the title of one of the courses I attended during a lay ministry day shortly after Easter. The timing could not have been more perfect for me! It came nine days after Easter, which is one of the most exciting seasons for the Family Project, with an Easter play, an Easter Trail, Messy Easter and an Easter Tree being a few of the things that the Family Project was connected to during this Easter season. Nine days after Easter, I was just beginning to need some time to rest before rethinking what new initiatives or projects we could commence whilst also continuing our current projects that have translated well online: See and Know Drop-in, St. Mary's Drop-in and St. Patrick's Youth Group.

I had booked onto this course months before and arrived, via zoom, to meet my fellow lay ministry colleagues. It was led by Edel McClean. In one of my previous posts, Edel had been my spiritual director. Someone I had gone to to share my thoughts about ministry, life and my big questions about faith. As soon as I realised that she was leading this course I knew it would be good. I was also aware that I would come away taking at least 'five minutes of wisdom' from Edel which would mean that that the whole day would feel worthwhile.

The five ways to support your well-being are based on the NHS' suggestions and a quick google brings up the key 5 steps. I found hearing them explained in more detail, with a pastoral tone rather than a medical one, gave me a deeper insight into what the five ways are, so I shall try to do similarly here for you!

Connect. Look for moments of connection. These connections do not have to be big. They can be things ranging from a walk with a friend to a text message or even an emoji text sent by someone who cares for you. Connection too can be found in all circumstances from a quiet moment of prayer to a rave.

Be active. When we hear "be active" many of us think of that athletic friend or colleague and that in itself can make us feel defeated. What counts as active ranges from person to person. Yet they all count. That is key to realise! Active for one person might be sitting up in bed. It could be gardening for some time. For another it might be going on that quick dog walk or a wild swim.

Take notice. The NHS often suggests mindfulness here, which is often helpful for many people, as it does train you to notice things. However, mindfulness doesn't work for everyone or it can just feel too intimidating. Taking notice is just that. It can be about noticing anything. One thing I have found helpful is washing up. Taking time to notice the temperature of the washing up water, looking at the colour and shape of any bubbles created and how the water feels against your skin. You might want to think about: What helps you pay attention? When do you pay attention? These might give clues as to when you want to practise taking notice further.

Keep Learning. The key thing for this one is to remember little things count. When I hear the term 'learning' I am transported back to school/college/university times. This shows how learning has too often been limited to mean study. Learning can be studying something you enjoy but it could also be trying out a new recipe each week or finding out a cool fact that may one day come in handy at a pub quiz.

Give. Research has shown that people who do things for others tend to have a positive outlook. However, with this one we have to be careful. I know many people reading this will be the doers of this world! Give can also mean giving yourself permission to say no to something and give yourself that extra time to do something for you. If giving yourself the gift of time feels too hard right now, look for a compromise. Find something that relaxes you but perhaps ends up benefiting someone else incidentally, such as baking! Give but as Edel said 'don't give everything.'

At the end we were advised to rate ourselves between 1-5 for each step so we could see which ones we might naturally be drawn to and which ones we perhaps need to prioritise more for our own well-being.

Ask yourself : Which needs your most attention? Which of these is manageable to focus on this week and/or which one feel manageable to focus on for a longer period of time, such as a month or three months.

Wellbeing is something that many in our community are keen to promote and enable so that everyone can find what will be beneficial and helpful to them personally. Wellbeing is something that the Family Project is also keen to explore and enable too. Keep an eye out for further opportunities that perhaps help you do one of these five steps above. Take care of yourself this month. **Lol**

Kirkby Lonsdale Tarts Reborn



We're reissuing this information on the Kirkby Lonsdale Tarts and Cakes, as with the ending of most Covid restrictions we can all now start to enjoy the pleasures of Kirkby Lonsdale again.

If you've read "The Annals of Kirkby Lonsdale", you might have seen that some years ago Jenny Metcalfe, who lived on Mill Brow, started making Kirkby Lonsdale Fair Cakes to sell at local fairs and at the weekly market, then later the "Two Miss Taylors" carried on the tradition and the town was "made famous by these cakes!". Audrey Phillips, a long-standing resident, and daughter of Jonty Wilson the famous smithy, and Honorary Committee member of the Kirkby Lonsdale and District Civic Society, together with fellow member Mike Marczynski and the other members of the committee, decided that it would be great to revive the tradition and approached Helen and Rachael Tate at The Crossing Point Café in The Square, to develop various cakes and tarts that could rightfully lay claim to the tradition of past times.

Audrey Phillips recalls the Miss Taylors from her childhood in Kirkby Lonsdale in the 1930s as quite formidable ladies, and remembers these local cakes as something akin to Eccles Cakes, but having their own unique flavour and texture. Here's a picture from High Biggins showing the Miss Taylors outside Biggins House.

And so it came to pass that a tasting session was arranged in the Crossing Point Café with Audrey and Mike, and The Two Miss Tates of the Crossing Point, who'd made a wonderful selection of special cakes and tarts to their own secret recipes, and a clear winner emerged. These Kirkby Lonsdale Tarts will now be sold at the café every day they're open, and not just on Market Days! Audrey certainly looks pleased as Punch, and it's great to see the historic tradition continue. Clearly, the Taste of Kirkby Lonsdale has been reborn by the Tates of Kirkby Lonsdale! Enjoy!

Big Vision Update

Work has very much been continuing on The Big Vision during the pandemic.

You may remember that The Big Vision is an initiative of the Churches (St Mary's Church, Kirkby Lonsdale Methodist Church and St Joseph's Roman Catholic Church) working together to widen the use of the Church buildings and their surroundings, so that they are even more widely used and appreciated by the community and the visitors to the town who are such an important part of the town's economy.

Our aim is 'that the Churches, the surroundings and the Rectory buildings are creatively and sustainably utilised for the benefit of the local community, visitors and Ministry and Mission of the church.'

As I write this, we are about to submit Expressions of Interest to the National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) for funding for some of the projects we have been working on. An Expression of Interest is the first stage in the grant application process for NLHF funding. We are aware that funding for projects such as ours is extremely competitive at the moment so are taking great care to ensure that we meet all the required criteria, which include heritage, community, COVID recovery and environmental sustainability.

There will be two Expressions of Interest. The first is for works to St Mary's Church, both internally and externally; you may be aware that the church clock is not currently working and you will not have heard the bells ring recently as access to the tower is too dangerous because of decay to the floors and the timbers supporting the clock. The roof and drainage systems of the Church are also in need of work. Internally, we wish to take the opportunity to upgrade the toilets and kitchen and consider changes to the seating arrangements and to possibly incorporate an office and some meeting space.

The second covers works to The Brow, Cockpit Hill, the Motte and the Glebe Field and we are delighted to be working with the Town Council on this Expression of Interest, which they will lead on, as they own the Brow. We feel that incorporating the development of the Glebe Field, Cockpit Hill and the Motte into this Expression of Interest will considerably strengthen its heritage credentials and thus, we hope, increase the chances of funding.

Many people will be aware that the Brow has been undercut by the River Lune over many years. This has now reached the stage where this undercutting is threatening the future of the Brow and footpath, and ultimately the Glebe Field, Cockpit Hill and the Motte and urgent works are now needed to protect it.

If no action is taken shortly, it will be necessary, on safety grounds, to close the footpath along the Brow

between the top of the Radical Steps as far at least as the entrance to the cemetery extension which could make access to the Glebe Field, Cemetery and Rugby Club problematic. A major tourist and heritage attraction would be lost, together with the opportunity to link Ruskin's View to other heritage assets in the town.

As part of this Expression of Interest, as well as undertaking works to stabilise the Brow, we would like to open up access to Cockpit Hill and the Motte, which have been under the cover of brambles for many years. If you are walking along the Brow footpath heading towards the Rugby Club, glance over the wall to your left just after you pass Ruskin's View and you will see Cockpit Hill and the Motte.

During our community consultation in 2019 there was an overwhelming majority in favour of opening up Cockpit Hill and the Motte to public access, and to provide interpretation for their history and heritage. They are the remains of a small medieval motte and bailey castle, one of a large number in the area, and formed part of the defensive line of castles built along the River Lune. Cockpit Hill is reputed to have been used as a cock fighting pit during the post medieval period, hence its name.

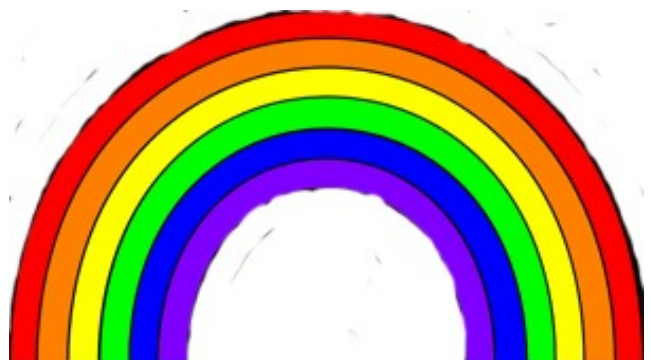
And, of course, being slightly higher than Ruskin's View, the view from here is, if anything, even better and more far reaching.

One possibility we are considering is, working with other key organisations in the town, to create a self guided town Heritage Trail with interpretation boards at key points which would link together the many historic places of interest in the town.

Kirkby Lonsdale CIC is working with Melling visual arts organisation Green Close to bring free art and wellbeing taster workshops to Kirkby Lonsdale as part of a new programme called Phoenix Rising. One of only 37 organisations nationally to have received a Thriving Communities grant from the National Academy for Social Prescribing, Arts Council England, Natural England and Historic England. The town has never seen an initiative like this before, which puts health at the heart of living and working in the community and will give locals the opportunity to socialise and recharge in a safe and welcoming creative space as Lockdown restrictions ease.

The Phoenix Rising Art Taster workshops will help to support the community beyond lockdown, especially as tourists return to the destination town and residents ready themselves for a busy post-lockdown summer. They precede the year-long Phoenix Rising programme of workshops which will be delivered by Green Close working with Lancashire Wildlife Trust, Mandala Preston yoga centre and The Gathering Fields eco-retreat, across North and Central Lancashire and South Cumbria from June. The taster programme in Kirkby Lonsdale is a special opportunity for LA6 residents to make space for their wellbeing needs, trying something creative that they have never done before.

The Phoenix Rising art tasters will take place online at first, starting with the four-week photography workshop Gratitude Gallery on Friday 30th April led by Ginny Koppenhol and the two-week map-making workshop Myths & Legends on Sunday 2nd May led by Kremena Dimitrova. The face-to-face workshops will begin in May, taking place at Lunesdale Hall in line with government guidelines. These will include a series of wellbeing drawing and making workshops exploring what makes our area special to us called Kirkby Towntastic from Sunday 23rd May led by Danielle Chapell-Aspinwall and some clay making workshops making your own candlestick called Tree of Life from Saturday 5th June led by Sue Flowers. Personally Plastic Free

When we think 'plastic free' we sometimes just assume that this only refers to food packaging or cleaning bottles. Have you ever taken a good look in your bathroom and noticed how many things come in plastic? From the bars of soap that come in plastic wrappers to the hundreds of different types of shampoo and conditioners, disposable razors and makeup that we use daily.

There is an alternative :

Shampoo and Conditioner: Replace your bottles with bars that last longer and have no waste. If you'd rather use bottled products, choose refillable options.

Shower Gel: Swap it for soap! And while you're at it, trade your plastic shower scrunchie for a soap saver bag. The bag acts as an exfoliator and when finished, just hang it up to dry, ready for your next wash.

Oral hygiene: Every plastic toothbrush ever made is still on the planet today! By changing your plastic toothbrush to a wooden one, think of how many you will be saving going forward. Have an electric toothbrush? There are recycled alternatives to replace these as well. Toothpaste now comes in a variety of different forms: in paste, powder and tablet form.

Deodorant: Consider using a natural deodorant which can be applied with your finger tips or rolled on from a cardboard tube. Why not go one better and use a crystal – they really do work and can last up to three years!

Shaving: Ditch the disposable razor in favour of a traditional model. Match it with shaving soap instead of foam and away you go – plastic-free shaving.

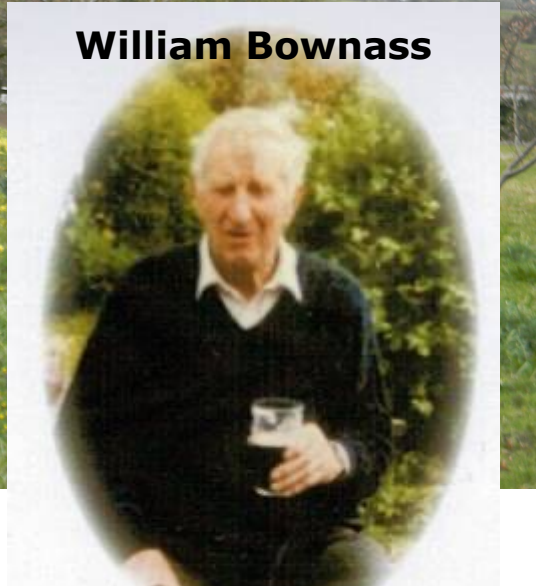

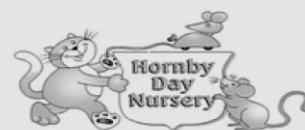

"My energy bill really shot up last month. I don't feel like I've been using any more heating or electricity than usual, so I'm worried I'm being overcharged. I've tried to contact my energy supplier for support, but no one ever seems to answer the phone or respond to my emails. I've waited on hold for nearly an hour several times before giving up. What should I do?"

It's normal for your energy bills to change depending on the time of year and how much gas and electricity you're using. But if your bills seem strangely high, then it's important to investigate why.

Firstly, check your [meter](#) is working properly and your usage has definitely not gone up, even accidentally. Also check what heaters you have and whether you're using them correctly. Night storage radiators and immersion heaters in particular can cause very high bills if used incorrectly.

There are [a few things](#) worth looking into. It could be that your bill is an estimate, in which case you need to give your supplier a new meter reading. If it's not an estimate, check your last meter reading to see if it matches the one on your bill. If you still don't have an answer, your supplier might have raised their prices. In any case, you're doing the right thing to contact them.

Customer service varies between suppliers and unfortunately we hear of many bad experiences similar to yours. We also know the problem has worsened during the pandemic. If you're struggling to get through to them, you could make a formal complaint. We offer advice on [how to do this](#) and things to consider first.

We publish a [comparison table](#) every three months which rates suppliers' customer service, based on things like telephone wait time, email response time and the accuracy of their bills. Have a look for yours to see how they fare against others. If they're low on the list, consider switching to a different one.

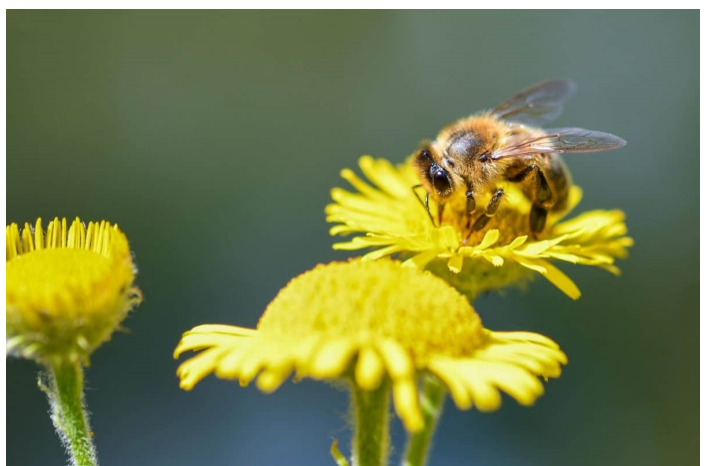

A stroll around Kirkby Lonsdale – from St Mary's Church along Fairbank to Underley

In the August and September 2020 editions of AKL I described two strolls around Kirkby Lonsdale – from the Market Square to Devil's Bridge, then along the River Lune to Mill Brow, and from St Mary's Church through Lily Wood to Underley Business Park. Until last month, the circular route back to town meant walking along the road. However, the Underley Estate has now generously created a footpath between the drive down to the Business Park and the former western gatehouse to the Estate.



The walk from St Mary's to the business park is about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile.

With the church tower behind you, head up Fairbank, passing The Orange Tree - reopening 17th May 😊. Look above the door to see an arm holding a rugby ball. Kirkby Lonsdale's rugby club was established in 1877, and when rugby fans from the town go to watch England play at Twickenham, they meet up at The Orange Tree in Richmond. Many England players have stayed at Kirkby Lonsdale's Orange Tree over the years.



Next on the right is The Gables, which used to be home to the Underley Estate

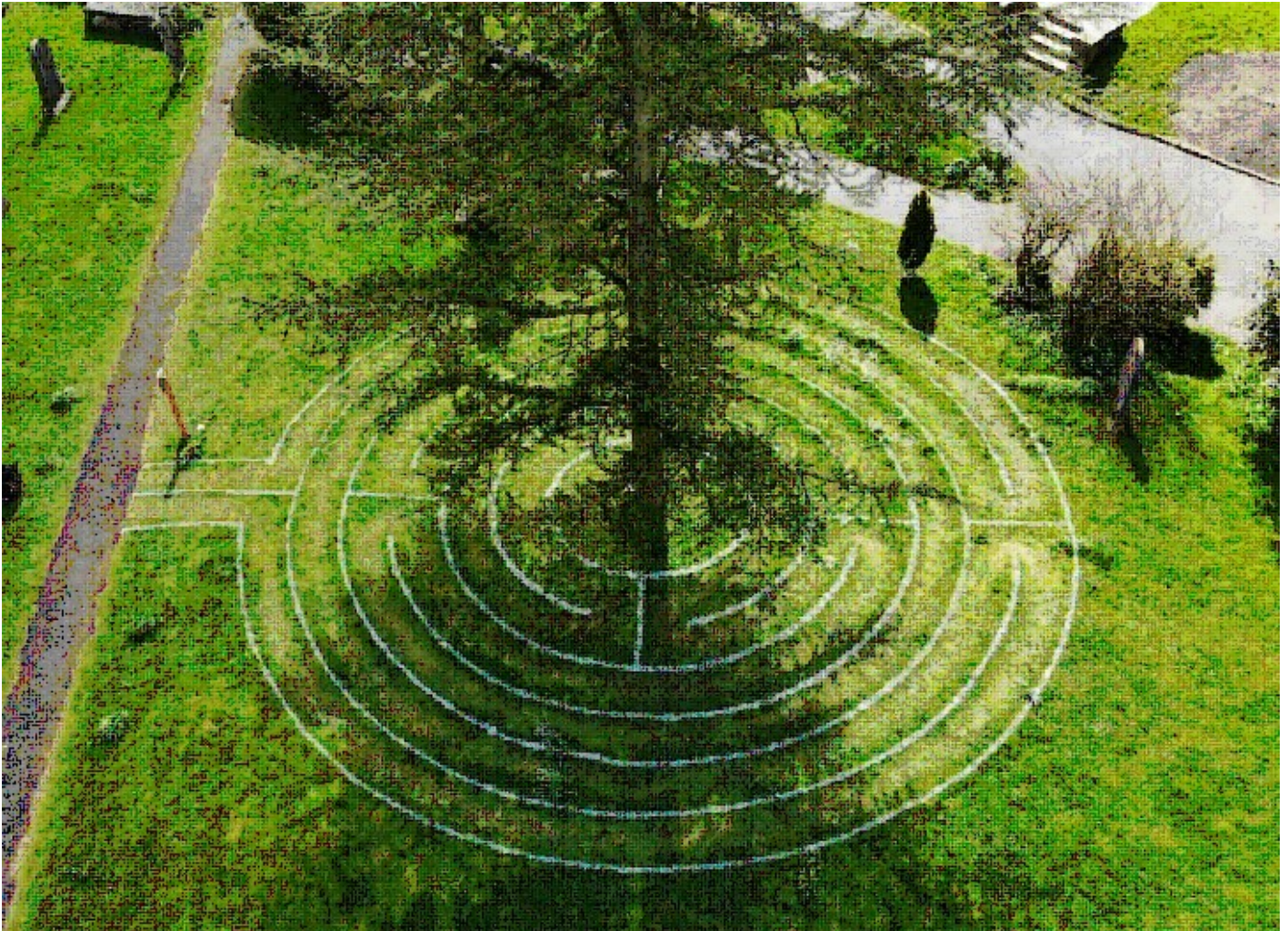
Agent's house. Opposite is Jonty Wilson's former smithy. Look at the old doors and you'll see where people have carved their initials while waiting for their horses to be shod!



Once out into the countryside, you'll see that the farmer has been hedging recently, and then you'll come to the former gatehouse of the estate, opposite which is the start of the new stretch of footpath, with fine views east to the Barbon Fells. At the end of the footpath take care crossing the road and you'll see a footpath sign pointing down the drive back to Kirkby Lonsdale.

Labyrinths

Unless you have suffered from labyrinthitis, the word 'labyrinth' will probably make you think of a Greek myth. The labyrinth was an elaborate prison constructed by the great inventor Daedalus to contain a flesh-eating monster known as the Minotaur. Young men and women were sent into this disorienting maze-like structure as sacrifices. The myth tells of how one of these sacrificial victims, Theseus, conquered the labyrinth and killed the Minotaur with the help of a ball of thread and a sword given to him by Ariadne, the king's daughter. He tied one end of the thread to the entrance of the labyrinth and unwound it as he followed the twisting path to the centre. He killed the Minotaur, retraced his steps by rewinding the thread, and escaped.

No one knows what lies behind the mythical prison but ancient labyrinth designs occur in many cultures and in many different places in the world. There are labyrinth structures and representations on rock carvings, jewellery, pottery and coins.

Today, the word labyrinth refers to an enclosed area with an entrance in the boundary, usually containing a single winding path leading to the centre after twisting and turning in such a way as to fill the space. To return to the starting point you simply retrace the path. (You may be wondering why Theseus needed a ball of string since, unlike a maze where there are many paths, you

cannot get lost in a labyrinth! The answer is that in the ancient world the word 'labyrinth' was used for both mazes and labyrinths. It didn't differentiate between the two).

Interestingly, from late antiquity to the Middle Ages, one of the places where you could find a labyrinth would be in a church or cathedral. Why? Because people saw that the labyrinth told the Easter story. Christ was like Theseus; he had entered the maze of the world from outside. He had achieved a victory and escaped from the prison of death. The safest way to journey through the world was to follow Christ. To give you an idea of the scale of some of these church labyrinths the largest surviving one is in Chartres Cathedral. It is over 12m in diameter and the total length of the winding pathway is 294m! (If you 'Google' Chartres Cathedral you will find pictures of it).

In recent years labyrinths have become very popular and rediscovered as playful, peaceful and prayerful places by all ages. The temporary labyrinth that was created in St Mary's churchyard for the Easter season was based upon a design which originally came from a fountain in Damascus.

Don't worry if you didn't get chance to experience it; it will be back!
