Mists and Mellow Fruitfulness

There are signs of autumn all around, and harvest festivals, harvest suppers and auctions have been taking place all over our parish. Harvest, and the themes of generosity and thankfulness, always make me think of a story that is thought to come from the Jewish Talmud but may also have roots in Muslim and Hindu culture.

Once upon a time in the land of Israel, there lived an old farmer. When he died, he left the farm to his two sons. They divided the land evenly and built their own houses on opposite sides. The younger brother soon married and had a family. The older brother did not marry but lived alone. Both brothers remained the best of friends. Each year at harvest time they gathered their crops, bundled the stalks into sheaves, and took them into their barns. Each year, after all their hard work, the brothers slept very well.

Then, one year at harvest-time, the elder brother lay awake and could not sleep. "It is not right," he thought, "that I should harvest and store as much grain as my brother. He has a family to feed and I have only myself. He needs more so that he can sell it and buy what he needs for his family." He decided to put things right. So, he went to his barn, took as many sheaves as he could manage, carried them across the farm and put them into his brother's barn. He returned to his bed and slept soundly.

That same night, the younger brother also found that he could not sleep. He too thought of his brother. "It is not right that I should harvest and store as much grain as my brother. I have a family to help me and to care for me in old age, while he works alone." So, he rose and went to his barn, took as many sheaves as he could manage and carried them across the farm to his brother's barn. He returned to his bed and slept soundly.

The next day, when each brother went to their barn, they were surprised to see as much grain as there had been the

day before. So, that night, each of them did the same thing; the older brother, took as many sheaves of grain as he could carry to his brother's barn, and the younger brother, narrowly missing him, did the same. When morning came, both brothers were again very puzzled when they discovered that they still had as much grain as before, despite having given some away.

On the third night, each brother rose, gathered as much grain as they could carry and headed out across the farm to their brother's barn. It was a dark night without any moonlight and this time they collided in the middle of the fields. They finally realised what had been happening and, dropping their bundles, they hugged one another. They knelt down in the field, and thanked God for giving them such a thoughtful and generous brother.

The numbers for this social gathering creep up each week as more people share it with their friends but

we would like to make sure everyone knows about the lunches each Monday before winter sets in.

Please ask neighbours or family who may be alone or may benefit from having a break from meal preparation, just call the Hub to book a lunch. The atmosphere in the hall is very relaxed with the gentle buzz of continuous chatter, not forgetting Kerry's delicious food, currently Cumberland sausage swirl with onion gravy or Cottage Pie, vegetarian option also available. Pre book meals via the Hub by previous Thursday 1pm.

The much-missed Meet 2 Eat returned at the start of September and is another step towards the familiar weekly catch up with friends. If you haven't ventured back yet or want to give it a visit, why not pop along to meet friends old and new for a lovely lunch time catch up. Kirkby Lonsdale and District Civic Society

We had a wonderful well attended Zoom talk, organised by Margaret Bunch, by Peter Jones and Steven King, the authors of "Navigating The Old English Poor Law: The Kirkby Lonsdale Letters 1809-1836".

It was fascinating to hear of the existence of many letters from people who'd originated from KL, and were in poverty elsewhere in the country, and wanting financial help or other help. They wrote many letters to the "Overseer of the Poor", and in our case, this was Stephen Garnett. In the attached letter, Margaret Gill is writing in June 1827, and is looking for money to help raise her child.

Her father, William Sorah, is the ostler at The Red Dragon. Times were obviously very tough. Any money used by the overseer was gathered from the folk of the parish as a local tax, and there could be resentment and tension between the ratepayers who contributed to the poor rate funds, and those seeking help via the overseer. It's fascinating that Peter Jones and Steven King have over 500 letters relating to Kirkby Lonsdale, which have yet to be published.


It's an amazing archive of times past, and we have to be thankful for the meticulous records kept by Stephen Garnett, and the fact that they've survived nearly 200 years.





Roadworks

The A683 at Station House, Middleton will be closed from Monday 27th September for approximately 4 weeks to facilitate essential drainage works.

A watercourse crosses the A683 opposite Station House and at the junction to Beckside Hall. The watercourse is carried beneath the road in a stone drain that will likely have been built with the original road and has now reached the end of its service life.

There have been problems with the culvert in the past, attempts to repair the stonework have been undertaken previously but have proven only to provide a short-term solution due to the age and condition of the structure.

Recent inspections show the condition of the culvert has deteriorated significantly and it is now collapsing extensively beneath the road. This is a concern, primarily due to the threat to the structural integrity of the carriageway and also due to the flood and ice risk caused by the blockage.

If we have a serious weather event there is significant risk of flow channelling behind the already compromised masonry leading to total collapse of the structure and ultimately the road above it.

Assent has been granted to CCC to carry out works to remove the existing stone culvert and completely replace with new pipes of increased capacity.

A full road closure has been organised and will be in operation 24 hours a day whilst the works are ongoing. Consideration will be given to directly affected residents of Beckside Hall / Hollins so that access / egress is possible from one side of the junction or the other during the works.

The signed diversion will be via A684 Kendal, A591 to A65 Crooklands and A65 to Kirkby Lonsdale.


